1 AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; amending grounds for disgualification from driving a commercial motor vehicle 2 for persons under twenty-one (21) years of age; authorizing 3 records to be considered for purposes of disqualification 4 5 from driving a commercial motor vehicle as specified; 6 adding violations that qualify as serious traffic 7 violations; authorizing the department to waive examinations for a commercial driver's license applicant as 8 9 specified; providing rulemaking authority; and providing 10 for effective dates.

(a) Any person is disgualified from driving a 17 commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less than one 18 (1) year if convicted of a first violation arising from 19 20 separate incidents of:

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22 (viii) Driving or being in actual physical 23 control of a motor vehicle while the alcohol concentration

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1 of the person's blood, breath or other bodily substance is 2 eight one-hundredths of one percent (0.08%) or more; -or 3 4 (ix) Driving or being in actual physical control 5 of a motor vehicle while the alcohol concentration of the 6 person's blood, breath or other bodily substance is two 7 one-hundredths of one percent (0.02%) or more if the person 8 is under twenty one (21) years of age and the person holds a valid commercial driver's license or commercial learner's 9 10 permit at the time of the offense; or 11 12 (ix) Violating any local ordinance or state law in another jurisdiction which is substantially similar 13

14 to any of the violations listed in this subsection.

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16 (q) Upon the department receiving credible information that the holder of a commercial driver's 17 18 license or commercial learner's permit is suspected of 19 obtaining the license in a fraudulent manner, the state 20 shall notify the license holder in writing at the address 21 on file that they have thirty (30) days to contact the department and schedule retesting. The notification shall 22 specify what tests must be retaken. If the license holder 23

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1	does not contact the department, does not take the test
2	required or fails any rescheduled test, the license holder
3	shall have his license cancelled and shall be disqualified
4	from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of one
5	(1) year. Once cancelled, the license holder shall be
6	required to reapply to the department to obtain a
7	commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit.
