4 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, no person shall operate a passenger vehicle 5 in this state unless each child who is a passenger in that 6 7 vehicle and who has not reached his ninth birthday nine (9) 8 years of age is properly secured in a child safety restraint system in a seat of the vehicle other than the 9 10 front seat, except if the vehicle is only equipped with one (1) row of seats, or if all safety belts in the rows of 11 12 seats behind the front seat are in use by other child passengers in the vehicle, the a child may be properly 13 secured in a child safety restraint system in the front 14 passenger seat of the vehicle, except that a rear-facing 15 16 infant seat child safety restraint system shall not be placed in front of an active airbag. The child safety 17 18 restraint system required by this subsection shall be 19 rear-facing until the child reaches either the age of two 20 (2) or the weight or height limit specified by the 21 manufacturer of the child safety restraint system.
