8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10	Section 1. W.S. 21-16-2001 is created to read:

6	(a) The Wyoming veteran loan repayment program is
7	created to be administered by the University of Wyoming.
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9	(b) To qualify for a loan under this section, the
10	applicant shall:
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12	(i) Be a United States citizen or a permanent
13	resident alien who meets the definition of an eligible
14	noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements or
15	requirements of a subsequent similar federal enactment;

17	(ii) Be a veteran;

19	(iii) Be enrolled in good standing in a social
20	work program, a counseling program or a psychology program
21	at the University of Wyoming leading to a:

23	(A) Baccalaureate degree; or

27 28	Under W.S. 21-7-601, the Wyoming teacher shortage loan repayment program, requires a recipient of a loan to teach
29	at least fifty percent (50%) of his working hours as a
30	teacher in special education, math, science, world
31	language, reading or English as a second language as a
32	certified teacher. The teacher shortage program also

33 requires an additional two (2) years for loan repayment.

10	academic program, shall commence monetary repayment of the
11	loan within two hundred eighty-five (285) days after
12	completion of the academic program.
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14	(g) Loan repayment options under this section may be
15	deferred for a period not to exceed five (5) years while a
16	loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty in the
17	armed forces as defined by W.S. 8-1-102(a)(xxi), the army
18	national guard or the air national guard.

2	and duties to implement this section and shall establish
3	terms and conditions of loans issued under this section,

8	(ii) The form and process for loan application,
9	review and award;

11	(iii) Criteria under which students may be
12	relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon,
13	in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would
14	cause undue hardship;

16	(iv) Criteria for determining the cost of
17	attendance as used in establishing the loan amount for the
18	academic programs listed in paragraph (b)(iii) of this
19	section, based upon each semester or summer school session
20	of full or part-time program attendance.

22	(j) Funding of the loan program established under
23	this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.

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2 (k) Repayment of loans and interest thereon shall be 3 credited to the school foundation program account.

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- 5 (m) The University of Wyoming shall annually review
- 6 the loan program established under this section and report
- 7 to the governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.
- 8 9-2-1014 regarding program results, funds received and
- 9 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together

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The Committee may wish to consider whether to add a sunset date to the loan repayment program under this section.

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34	(a) There is appropriated <mark>XX (\$XX)</mark> dollars from the <mark>XX</mark>
