1	AN ACT relating to education; establishing the Wyoming
2	veteran loan repayment program; specifying eligibility;
3	providing for loan repayment for veterans who provide
4	mental health services within this state to veterans;
5	providing a definition; requiring reporting; providing an
6	appropriation; and providing for an effective date.
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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10	Section 1. W.S. 21-16-2001 is created to read:

12	ARTICLE 20

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1 WYOMING VETERAN LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM 2 3 21-16-2001. Wyoming veteran loan repayment program; 4 eligibility criteria; procedures; reporting. 5 (a) The Wyoming veteran loan repayment program is 6 7 created to be administered by the University of Wyoming. 8 9 (b) To qualify for a loan under this section, the applicant shall: 10 11 12 (i) Be a United States citizen or a permanent 13 resident alien who meets the definition of an eligible noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements or 14 requirements of a subsequent similar federal enactment; 15 16 17 (ii) Be a veteran; 18 19 (iii) Be enrolled in good standing in a course of 20 study leading to a masters degree in social work, 21 counseling or psychology at the University of Wyoming. 22

1 (c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated 2 for this program, loans under this section may be granted 3 to qualified applicants to pay the cost of attendance for 4 the masters degree programs listed in paragraph (b)(iii) of this section. For purposes of this subsection, "cost of 5 attendance" means the sum cost of tuition, mandatory fees, 6 7 room and board, books and supplies, travel and personal 8 expenses to attend the University of Wyoming as determined annually by the University of Wyoming. 9

11 (d) Any federal, state or other grants or funding, 12 other than loans received by the applicant for the cost of attendance for a qualifying masters degree program shall be 13 prioritized by the University of Wyoming and applied before 14 a loan provided under this section. A loan provided under 15 16 this section shall not exceed the cost of attendance for a qualifying masters program, reduced by the amounts of any 17 federal, state or other grants or funding received by the 18 19 applicant.

(e) A recipient of a loan under this section may repay
the loan without monetary payment by working not less than
XX (XX%) of his working hours providing mental health

services within this state to veterans. To qualify for 1 2 repayment under this subsection, work shall be performed within the minimum amount of time necessary to repay the 3 4 loan, plus XX (XX) years, which shall begin with the calendar month following the month in which the student 5 6 completed the masters degree program. 7 8 ***** 9 10 STAFF COMMENT 11 The Committee will need to determine the following: 12 • The percentage of the working hours that a recipient 13 must provide mental health services within this state 14 to veterans. 15 • The additional number of years a recipient of a loan 16 is required to work for loan repayment. 17 18 The Committee may wish to consider amending the work 19 requirement. Other loan repayment programs are provided 20 below for the Committee's reference: 21 Wyoming teacher shortage loan repayment program (W.S. 22 21 - 7 - 601) 23 o Requires a recipient of a loan to teach at least 24 fifty percent (50%) of his working hours as a 25 teacher in special education, math, science, 26 world language, reading or English as a second 27 as a certified teacher. The teacher language 28 shortage program also requires an additional two 29 (2) years for loan repayment. 30 • Wyoming investment in nursing loan and grant program 31 (W.S. 9-2-123) 32 o Requires to be working in Wyoming as a nurse or nurse educator with the following timelines: 33 34 If the loan can be repaid with work of two 35 (2) years or less, within three (3) years;

9	• WAANI (W.S. 21-17-109) o The repayment period commences one (1) year after
10	the date on which the student ceases to be
11	enrolled in a fully accredited medical school or
12	residency program, whichever is the later as
13	determined by the University.
14	o In the first four (4) years of repayment, a
15	student may still return to Wyoming and their
16	payments will be suspended and repaid after the
17	completion of the work requirement.
18	o The statute requires graduates to work in Wyoming
19	for not more than three (3) years as the board
20	requires.
21	o WWAMI contracts provide:
22	Upon completion of the first year of full
23	time work in Wyoming, one third of the total
24	accrued balance at that point shall be
25	canceled.
26	Upon completion of the second year of full
27	time work in Wyoming, one half of the total
28	accrued balance at that point shall be
29	canceled.
30	Upon completion of the third year of full
31	time work in Wyoming, all remaining amounts
32	owed to the University under the contract,
33	plus interest, shall be canceled.
34	 The cancellation shall apply first to
35	interest accrued and then to principal.
36	• WICHE (W.S. 21-16-202)
37	o The repayment period commences one (1) year after
38	the date on which the student ceases to be
39	enrolled in the eligible program.
40	o The statute requires graduates to work in Wyoming
41	for not less than three (3) years as the
42	commission requires.
43	o WICHE contracts provide that the total accrued
44	balance including interest shall be cancelled

1 upon completing three (3) years of full time 2 professional practice in Wyoming. • WYDENT (W.S. 21-17-119) 3 o The repayment period commences one (1) year after 4 5 the date on which the student ceases to be 6 enrolled in a dental program. 7 o The statute requires graduates to work in Wyoming for a period of three (3) years. 8 o WYDENT contract is the same provisions as the 9 10 WWAMI contract. • Title IV-E Stipend Program (DFS Program) 11 12 o Federal program between the universities and 13 child welfare agencies that provides financial aid to students who majored in social work 14 15 pursuing a bachelorette or master's degree. 16 o The Wyoming Department of Family Services and the 17 University of Wyoming participated in the program 18 from 2004 to 2010. 19 o The stipend amount included tuition and fees for 20 not more than four (4) semesters. o In return for the stipend, bachelor's students 21 had to work one (1) full time equivalent month 2.2 23 for each three (3) semester hours for which they received funds and master's students had to work 24 25 one (1) full time equivalent month for each two 26 (2) semester hours for which they received funds. • This means if a bachelor's student took 12 27 semester hours for 4 semesters, then the 28 student would be required to work for 4 29 30 years to repay the stipend amount. 31 32 ***** 33 34 35 36 (f) Any recipient of a loan under this section who 37 fails: 38 39 (i) To complete the masters degree program for 40 which the loan was provided shall commence monetary

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repayment of the loan not later than forty-five (45) days
 after the recipient leaves the masters degree program;

4 (ii) To obtain employment that provides mental 5 health services within this state to veterans within two 6 hundred forty (240) days after successfully completing the 7 masters degree program, shall commence monetary repayment 8 of the loan within two hundred eighty-five (285) days after 9 completion of the masters degree program.

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(g) Loan repayment options under this section may be deferred for a period not more than five (5) years while a loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty in the armed forces as defined by W.S. 8-1-102(a)(xxi), the army national guard or the air national guard.

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(h) The University of Wyoming shall have the powers and duties to implement this section and shall establish terms and conditions of loans issued under this section, including:

22 (i) Interest rates and loan terms;

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(ii) The form and process for loan application,
 review and award;

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4 (iii) Criteria under which students may be 5 relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon, 6 in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would 7 cause undue hardship;

9 (iv) Criteria for determining the cost of 10 attendance as used in establishing the loan amount for the 11 masters degree programs listed in paragraph (b)(iii) of 12 this section, based upon each semester or summer school 13 session of full or part-time program attendance.

(j) Funding of the loan program established under this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.

18 (k) Repayment of loans and interest thereon shall be19 credited to the school foundation program account.

20

21 (m) The University of Wyoming shall annually review 22 the loan program established under this section and report 23 to the governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.

1 9-2-1014 regarding program results, funds received and 2 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together 3 with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and 4 repayments under the program. 5 (n) This program created by this section shall expire 6 7 effective June 30, 2035. 8 (o) As used in this section "veteran" means any 9 10 person who served in the United States armed forces as 11 defined by W.S. 8-1-102(a) (xxi), the army national guard or 12 air national quard and who was discharged or released under 13 conditions other than dishonorable. 14 Section 2. 15 16 (a) There is appropriated XX (\$XX) dollars from the XX 17 to the University of Wyoming for the period beginning July 18 19 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026. This appropriation shall 20 be used for the loan program established by section 1 of 21 this act and as authorized by subsection (b) of this section. This appropriation shall not be transferred or 22 23 expended for any other purpose and any unexpended,

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1	unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall
2	revert as provided by law on June 30, 2026. It is the
3	intent of the legislature that this appropriation be
4	included in the standard budget request for the University
5	of Wyoming for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium.
6	
7	(b) Not more than <mark>XX</mark> percent of the amount
8	appropriated under this section shall be used by the
9	University of Wyoming for the administration costs of this
10	program, including expenses of the University of Wyoming,
11	loan administration fees and marketing costs to advertise
12	availability of the program.
