26	status; who has a valid nonimmigrant status in the United
27	States; who has a pending application for asylum in the

United States; who has a pending or approved application for temporary protected status (TPS) in the United States;

who has approved deferred action status; or who has a

pending application for lawful permanent residence (LPR) or
