1 AN ACT relating to the prioritization of cease and transfer projects for municipal solid waste facilities; authorizing 2 expenditure of previously appropriated funds; establishing 3 a prioritized list of projects; establishing a maximum 4 amount to be expended on projects; granting the department 5 6 of environmental quality limited discretionary authority to 7 modify the prioritized list; specifying expenditures for a providing definitions; 8 carcass management project; 9 requiring reports; repealing a prior priority list of cease 10 and transfer projects; and providing for an effective date.

8 (c) Any municipal solid waste facility operator may apply for the funds associated with the carcass management 9 project listed as priority 1 in subsection (b) of this 10 11 section. Funds for the carcass management project shall be 12 expended only for infrastructure necessary to haul, bury or 13 compost dead animals. Funds expended under this subsection 14 shall not exceed the amount listed in priority 1 in subsection (b) of this section. 15

17 (d) The department of environmental quality may 18 modify the authorized funds and the order of the projects 19 listed in the prioritized list contained in subsection (b) 20 of this section for any of the following reasons: 21

22 (i) To optimize efficiency;

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1 (ii) Based on project readiness; 2 3 (iii) Based on compliance with grant or loan 4 qualifications or conditions; 5 б (iv) To address emergency or immediate 7 environmental concerns. 8 9 (e) Not later than October 15 of each year, the 10 department of environmental quality shall report: 11 12 (i) Any modification of the prioritized list contained in subsection (b) of this section to the joint 13 minerals, business and economic development interim 14 committee and the joint appropriations committee; 15 16 17 (ii) The names of recipients and amounts expended for the carcass management project established by 18 19 priority 1 in subsections (b) and (c) of this section to 20 the joint minerals, business and economic development interim committee. 21 22
