1 AN ACT relating to health care; establishing the Wyoming health care authority; providing for membership of the 2 authority; authorizing the appointment of an executive 3 director; specifying purposes and powers of the authority; 4 5 requiring reports; specifying confidentiality; creating a penalty; providing definitions; providing an appropriation; 6 7 and providing for effective dates. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-3301 through 9-2-3304 are created 11 12 to read:

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2	ARTICLE 33 - WYOMING HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY
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4	9-2-3301. Wyoming health care authority; membership;
5	compensation; executive director; definitions.

7	(a) As used in this article:
8	
9	(i) "Authority" means the Wyoming health care
10	authority created by this subsection;
11	
12	(ii) "Board" means the board of the Wyoming
13	health care authority.
14	
15	(b) Commencing July 1, 2025, there is created the
16	Wyoming health care authority, which is a body politic and
17	corporate operating as an instrumentality of the state of
18	Wyoming, with authority to adopt an official seal and to
19	sue and be sued.
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23 24	STAFF COMMENT

As a general note, this bill draft was modeled after the structure of the Wyoming Energy Authority and includes suggested language from the proposal that the Governor's Office provided for the Committee's first meeting in Afton.

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9 The authority shall be governed by a board 10 composed of thirteen (13) voting members appointed by the governor. Except as provided in this subsection, all voting 11 members shall be appointed for four (4) year terms and with 12 the advice and consent of the senate. Without the advice 13 14 and consent of the senate, the governor shall appoint seven 15 (7) initial voting board members to a term of four (4) years and shall appoint the remaining six (6) initial 16 17 voting board members to a term of two (2) years. Voting members may be reappointed but shall serve not more than 18 three (3) consecutive terms. Any voting member who has 19 served three (3) consecutive terms may be reappointed to 20 the board following an absence of not less than one (1) 21 22 year from service on the board. The governor may remove any member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Vacancies shall be 23 24 filled by appointment by the governor in accordance with 25 W.S. 28-12-101. The members shall elect from the membership 26 a chairman, vice-chairman and secretary. A majority of the

1	persons appointed and serving as members of the board shall
2	be qualified voters of the state of Wyoming. The board
3	membership shall include each of the following members:

5	(i) A licensed physician practicing in Wyoming;

7	(ii) A licensed nurse practicing in Wyoming;

9	(iii) A Wyoming hospital administrator;
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11	(iv) An administrator of a federally qualified
12	health center or facility in Wyoming;

15	provider operating in Wyoming;

17	(vi) A licensed behavioral health provider
18	practicing in Wyoming;

20	(vii) An administrator or dean of a Wyoming
21	higher education institution;

23	(viii) A Wyoming business owner;

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2	(ix) A representative of a private insurance
3	carrier operating in Wyoming;

5	(x) A representative of an insurance carrier
6	which provides coverage through the federal health
7	insurance marketplace, operating in Wyoming;
8	
9	(xi) A member of the Eastern Shoshone or Northern
10	Arapaho tribe, or the cooperative tribal governing body;
11	
12	(xii) Two (2) members at large.
13	
14	(d) The following persons shall serve as ex officio,
15	nonvoting members of the board:

17	(i) The governor or a designee from the office
18	of the governor;
19	
20	(ii) The director of the department of health or
21	the director's designee;

1	(iii) The director of the department of
2	insurance or the director's designee;
3	
4	(iv) The director of the department of
5	administration and information or the director's designee;
6	
7	(v) The director of the department of family
8	services or the director's designee;
9	
10	(vi) The director of the department of workforce
11	services or the director's designee;
12	
13	(vii) The chairmen of the joint labor, health
14	and social services interim committee or a designee
15	appointed by the appropriate chairperson.
16	
17	(e) The board shall meet regularly but not less than
18	four (4) times each year. Members of the board who are not
19	government employees or public officers shall receive the
20	same per diem, expenses and travel allowance as members of
21	the legislature under W.S. $28-5-101$ while in attendance at
22	meetings of the board and while performing their duties as
23	members of the board. Members who are government employees

1 or public officials shall be considered on off:

- 2 business of their agency when performing duties as members
- 3 of the board.

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- 5 (f) The authority may employ and fix the compensation
- 6 of an executive director who shall serve at the pleasure of
- 7 the authority. The executive director shall serve as the
- 8 administrative head of the authority and perform duties
- 9 prescribed by the authority to assist in carrying out the
- 10 duties imposed by this article.

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This bill draft creates the position of executive director for the Wyoming health care authority. The Committee may wish to consider if there is a specific agency or other place to house the executive director based on the policy preferences of the Committee.

23242526	Paragraph (viii) above allows the health care authority to enter into partnerships with other health care entities and is based on similar language of the powers granted to the

Wyoming Energy Authority. The Committee may wish to consider if additional detail is required to properly outline the scope of the Health Care Authority's ability to enter into partnerships, such as whether the Authority may provide services or whether fees or costs may be assessed, when determining the policy considerations of this bill draft.

Additionally, subsection (c) below requires the Authority to submit a budget for administrative expenses. The Wyoming Energy authority is given the power to "receive by gift, grant, donation or otherwise, any sum of money, aid or assistance from the United States, the state of Wyoming, any political subdivision or any other public or private entity or any country in good standing with the United States subject to federal law". The Committee may wish to consider if the Wyoming Health Care Authority should be granted this power to provide additional funding for the Authority's activities to accomplish the purposes of this bill draft.

(b) The sole recourse of any party contracting with
the authority shall be against the authority, and there
shall be no cause of action against the state or any
county, municipality or other political subdivision of the
state.

31 (c) The authority shall submit its budget for review 32 as provided by W.S. 9-2-1010 through 9-2-1014. Any 33 appropriation to the authority shall be expended only for 1 administrative purposes, which shall include planning and

2 research.

4 (d) The authority shall annually report to the

5 governor and the joint labor, health and social services

6 interim committee not later than October 1 with respect to

7 the progress of the authority in meeting its purposes and

8 goals under this article. The authority shall provide any

9 legislative recommendations for the improvement of health

4 (a) The Wyoming health care authority is authorized up 5 to one (1) full-time position for period beginning with the 6 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2026.

(b) There is appropriated XXXX dollars (\$XXXX.00) from the general fund to the Wyoming health care authority for purposes of employing an executive director and for salary, administrative expenses and costs of implementing the provisions of this act by the board of the Wyoming health care authority. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2026. This appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2026.
