12	individualized goals for persons of all ages and ability
13	levels that are delivered during the course of a
14	therapeutic relationship.

18	(a) It is unlawful for a person to profess to be a
19	music therapist or advertise in any form or hold themselves
20	out to the public as a music therapist, board-certified
21	music therapist or use the initials "MT-BC" or any other
22	words, letters, abbreviations or insignia indicating or

23 implying that the person is a music therapist unless the

- 1 person holds and maintains a music therapist board-

The Iowa legislation this bill draft was modeled after contains a criminal penalty for persons who hold themselves out to be music therapists but are not credentialed by the Certification Board for Music Therapists, a national, outof-state entity. The penalty modeling Iowa's legislation was removed from this bill draft because it could likely be a due process violation under Article 1, Section 6 of the Wyoming Constitution and the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution for someone to be charged with a out-of-state crime for not meeting an entity's credentialing requirement where Wyoming has no control over the out-of-state entity. In other words, a private entity like the Certification Board for Music Therapists cannot decide whether someone can be licensed or credentialed and then if the Board refuses to issue a license or credential, the State charges a person with a crime if they hold themselves out to be a music therapist based on the determination of the out-of-state Certification Board.
