Wyoming health care commission.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to health care; establishing the Wyoming 2 health care commission within the governor's office; providing for membership of the commission; authorizing the 3 appointment of an executive director for the commission; 4 5 authorizing the commission to contract for services; 6 specifying duties of the commission; requiring reports; 7 providing for the sunset of the commission; providing 8 appropriations; and providing for an effective date. 9

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 11

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Section 1. W.S. 9-2-2805 through 9-2-2809 are created to read:

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9-2-2805. Health care commission created; membership;
 salary; meetings; advisory subcommittees.

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7 (a) The Wyoming health care commission is established 8 within the governor's office to study issues related to the 9 access, cost and quality of health care for Wyoming 10 citizens.

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12 (b) The commission shall consist of thirteen (13) 13 members appointed by the governor. A majority of the 14 persons appointed and serving as members of the commission 15 shall be qualified voters of the state of Wyoming. The 16 governor shall designate one (1) member to serve as 17 chairman. The commission membership shall include each of 18 the following voting members:

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20 (i) A licensed physician practicing in Wyoming;
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22 (ii) A licensed nurse practicing in Wyoming;

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1 (iii) A Wyoming hospital administrator; 2 3 (iv) An administrator of a federally qualified 4 health center or health facility in Wyoming; 5 6 (v) A licensed emergency medical services 7 provider operating in Wyoming; 8 9 (vi) A licensed behavioral health provider practicing in Wyoming; 10 11 12 (vii) An administrator or dean of a Wyoming 13 higher education institution; 14 15 (viii) A Wyoming business owner; 16 17 (ix) A representative of a private insurance carrier operating in Wyoming; 18 19 20 (x) A representative of an insurance carrier operating in Wyoming that provides coverage through the 21 22 federal health insurance marketplace; 23

1 (xi) A representative of the Eastern Shoshone 2 tribe or Northern Arapaho tribe, or a representative of the 3 cooperative tribal governing body; 4 (xii) Two (2) members at large. 5 6 7 (c) The following persons shall serve as ex officio, 8 nonvoting members of the commission: 9 10 (i) The director of the department of health or 11 the director's designee; 12 13 (ii) The director of the department of insurance or the director's designee; 14 15 16 (iii) The director of the department of 17 administration and information or the director's designee; 18 19 (iv) The director of the department of family 20 services or the director's designee; 21 22 (v) The director of the department of workforce 23 services or the director's designee;

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1 2 (vi) The chairmen of the joint labor, health and 3 social services interim committee or a designee appointed 4 by the appropriate chairperson. 5 6 7 ***** 8 STAFF COMMENT 9 10 The membership of the Wyoming Health Care Commission as outlined above is the same as the membership of the board 11 for the Wyoming Health Care Authority (25LSO-0037). The 12 13 Committee may wish to consider the membership of the 14 Commission for the policy purposes of this bill draft. 15 16 ***** 17 18 (d) Appointed commission members shall serve until 19 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this 20 21 article. If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the 22 governor shall appoint a new member to fill the vacancy. 23 The governor may remove members as provided in W.S. 9-1-24 202. Members of the commission who are not government 25 employees or public officers shall receive the same per 26 diem, expenses and travel allowance as members of the legislature under W.S. 28-5-101 while in attendance at 27 meetings of the commission and while performing their 28 duties as members of the commission. Members who are 29

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government employees or public officials shall be 1 considered on official business of their agency when 2 3 performing duties as members of the board. 4 5 ***** 6 7 STAFF COMMENT 8 The Wyoming Health Care Commission, as created by this bill 9 draft, is modeled after other statutory Commissions and 10 11 does not include terms limits for members due to the fact that the Commission is time-limited and is currently set to 12 in 2030. The Committee may wish to consider to 13 sunset establishing terms for the members of the Commission for 14 15 the policy purposes of this bill draft. 16 17 ***** 18 19 20 (e) The commission shall meet regularly but not less than four (4) times per year. Seven (7) voting members 21 shall constitute a quorum of the commission to conduct 22 business. 23 24 25 (f) As used in this article, "commission" means the 26 Wyoming health care commission created by this section. 27 28 (g) The commission may form advisory subcommittees to assist with the duties imposed under this article. An 29 advisory subcommittee may include commission members and 30 6 [Bill Number] 2025

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any other person who has expertise in the area of study to 1 2 be considered by the advisory subcommittee. 3 4 (h) The commission is subject to the requirements of: 5 The Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, 6 (i) 7 W.S. 16-3-101 through 16-3-105; 8 9 (ii) The Wyoming Public Records Act, W.S. 16-4-10 201 through 16-4-205; 11 12 (iii) The Wyoming Public Meetings Act, W.S. 16-4-13 401 through 16-4-408. 14 15 9-2-2806. Executive director; appointment; duties; 16 contracts for services; attorney general to represent. 17 18 (a) The governor, with the advice of the commission, 19 shall appoint an executive director who shall serve at the 20 pleasure of the commission. The executive director shall serve as the administrative head of the commission and 21 22 perform duties to assist the commission in carrying out the 23 duties imposed under this article.

1 2 (b) The executive director shall receive compensation 3 and be reimbursed for travel and other necessary expenses 4 as prescribed by the commission and approved by the 5 governor. 6 7 (c) The commission, with approval from the governor, 8 may contract for services with recognized health care systems experts as necessary to assist in the technical 9 10 aspects of data development, review and analysis. 11 12 (d) The attorney general shall be the legal advisor 13 for the commission. 14 15 9-2-2807. Health care commission duties. 16 17 (a) The commission shall develop strategies to improve health care and reduce health care costs for Wyoming 18 19 citizens by holding public meetings throughout the state, 20 hearing from experts and other interested parties, studying and researching other states' actions on health care, 21 22 studying and utilizing data related to health care and 23 considering past efforts and future possibilities that may

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1 useful in decision making. The commission shall be 2 formulate solutions or recommendations to address and 3 improve the following: 4 5 (i) Access to an affordable, effective and 6 quality health care system for Wyoming, including rural 7 areas of the state; 8 9 (ii) Access to affordable health insurance; 10 11 (iii) Issues of wellness and individual 12 responsibility for personal health; 13 14 (iv) Disease prevention and management; 15 16 (v) Workforce shortages among health care 17 providers and similar professionals; 18 19 20 ***** 21 STAFF COMMENT 22 Based on the Committee's consideration of the availability 23 and access to obstetric and gynecological care and 24 providers in Wyoming this interim, paragraph (ix) on the 25 next page, provides a specific duty for the Commission to 26 consider that topic. The Committee may wish to consider 27

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whether that is adequately covered in paragraph (v) or if 1 2 any additional duties should be added to the Commission. 3 4 **** 5 6 7 (vi) Identification of regulatory burdens on health care industries in Wyoming through collaboration 8 9 with health care partners, Wyoming state agencies and other 10 governmental agencies; 11 12 (vii) Cost shifting by health care providers that 13 occurs as a result of low reimbursement from public and 14 other programs; 15 16 (viii) Transparency and effective communication in the health care system; 17 18 19 (ix) Access to obstetric and gynecological 20 providers and care throughout the state; 21 2.2 (x) The aging population in Wyoming and the long 23 term care services that will be needed by that population; 24

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1 (xi) A system to investigate and reduce health 2 care errors with provision of compensation for errors due 3 to negligence; 4 (xii) Except as provided by subsection (b) of 5 this section, other issues as deemed appropriate by the 6 7 governor and the commission. 8 9 (b) It shall not be the purpose or duty of the 10 commission to consider the scope of practice of any 11 licensed health care profession. 12 13 9-2-2808. Reports; recommendations for legislation. 14 The commission shall annually report to the governor and 15 16 the joint labor, health and social services interim 17 committee not later than October 1 with respect to the progress of the commission in meeting its duties under this 18 19 article. The commission may provide legislative 20 recommendations for the improvement of health care in Wyoming and for the advancement or improvement of any of 21 22 the study areas that form the duties of the commission 23 under W.S. 9-2-2807(a).

1 2 9-2-2809. Sunset of the commission. 3 4 W.S. 9-2-2805 through 9-2-2808 are repealed effective June 30, 2030. 5 6 7 Section 2. 8 (a) The governor's office is authorized up to one (1) 9 10 full-time position to employ an executive director for the Wyoming health care commission for the period beginning 11 12 with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 13 2030. 14 15 (b) There is appropriated XXXX dollars (\$XXXX.00) from the general fund to the governor's office for purposes of 16 17 employing an executive director and for salary, 18 administrative expenses and costs of implementing the 19 provisions of this act by the Wyoming health care 20 commission. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 21 22 June 30, 2026. This appropriation shall not be transferred 23 or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended,

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1 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall 2 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2026. 3 4 ***** 5 6 STAFF COMMENT 7 Section 2 on the previous page provides template language 8 9 to authorize one FTE and an appropriation to the Governor's Office for the Committee's consideration in determining 10 11 what, if any, appropriation may be needed to create and 12 operate the Wyoming Health Care Commission. 13 14 ***** 15 16 17 18 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 20 21 Constitution. 22 23 (END)
