- 22 **Section 3.** There is appropriated XXX dollars (\$XXX)

12	revert as provided by law on June 30, 2028. It is the
13	intent of the legislature that this appropriation not be
14	included in the standard budget for the department of
15	education for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium.
