1	AN ACT relating to the use of the Hathaway scholarships at
2	private post secondary schools; defining terms; creating a
3	scholarship; establishing eligibility requirements;
4	establishing payment of scholarship funds to private post
5	secondary schools; specifying success curriculum
6	requirements; modifying the duties of the department of
7	education; requiring rulemaking; requiring reporting;
8	making conforming amendments; and providing for an
9	effective date.

14	STAFF COMMENT

Significant guidance on the policy choices is required by the Committee to operationalize use of the Hathaway for payment to private post secondary schools. Because private post secondary schools operate in a different manner than the University of Wyoming or the community colleges, it is not possible to amend the existing program to include private post secondary schools using the same requirements and conditions as the current Hathaway scholarship program. The decision points are noted at the appropriate location of the bill draft. At the highest level, the following questions require resolution to finalize the bill draft:

1. What is the payment schedule under this scholarship? Is it a lump sum upon acceptance to the program? Does it differ based on the specific school? How will the differences in payment schedules by private post secondary schools be accounted for in operation of the program? WyoTech offers a 9 month and a 6 month certificate. Payments are made monthly and do not follow the traditional semester format. Frontier Bible College and the Wyoming Catholic College align closer to the University of Wyoming and the community colleges. As the Hathaway Program exists currently, the payments are made based on semesters.

2. How much is awarded under the scholarship? Are the students eligible for the Hathaway needs based scholarship pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1306? The 9 month standard program at WyoTech costs approximately \$34,850. The cost for the 6 month welding certificate at WyoTech is approximately \$27,600. The cost for an Associate of Arts degree from the Frontier Bible College is approximately \$19,500. The cost for a 4 year Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts degree at the Wyoming Catholic College is \$32,300.

3. Are the awards tiered based on academic performance and completion of the success curriculum? How much is awarded and what are the academic requirements for receipt of the funds? The amount awarded under the Hathaway program is dependent upon the student's grade point average and score on a nationally normed assessment or a career-technical aptitude test. The success curriculum requirements differ for each scholarship.

4. What private post secondary schools are eligible for payment under the scholarship - nationally accredited post secondary schools and state accredited schools? WyoTech and the Wyoming Catholic College nationally accredited. Frontier Bible College accredited by the state, but is not nationally accredited. The rigor required for state accredited schools is post secondary very different than nationally accredited post secondary schools. With the exception of private religious degree granting post secondary schools that issue specific diplomas, private degree granting post secondary institutions are required to be licensed by the Department of Education pursuant to W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-2-407.

5. Because the operation of private post secondary schools vary, how will satisfactory academic progress be measured? The requirements for University of Wyoming and the community colleges are based academic performance that is measure each semester and students that do not meet the requirement for one scholarship, may be eligible to receive a lesser amount under a different scholarship.

How will this operate for schools like WyoTech that have a compressed program? The bill as drafted charges the Department of Education with this task.

In consideration of this policy choice, W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-23-407 are relevant. These statutes govern the operation and licensure of private degree granting post secondary institutions. Depending on the definition adopted by the Committee, conforming amendments are likely. Note, private religious post secondary degree granting institutions that issue a diploma of religious studies, an associate of religious studies, associate of arts of religious studies, bachelor of religious studies, or a bachelor of arts of religious studies are exempt from the licensure requirements.

- 1. Identify the maximum award. Is the maximum award the cost of attendance, inclusive of room, board, books and other fees, or the cost of tuition only?
- 2. Identify the maximum time for eligibility for this scholarship. Currently, the Hathaway scholarships are limited to 8 full-time semesters. This will not coincide with the operation of WyoTech. It does not operate on semesters.
- 3. Identify the continuing eligibility requirements, if any, including providing a definition of "satisfactory academic progress" specific to the scholarship. The requirements will need to take into consideration the differences in the operation of private post secondary schools.
- 4. Identify requirements for reinstatement of the scholarship or state explicitly reinstatement is not authorized if the scholarship is lost.

The Hathaway scholarships require a minimum enrollment of 6 hours per semester to receive a scholarship unless the student is enrolled in a program at a Wyoming community college that requires on-the-job training and credit hours to receive a certificate.
