1 AN ACT relating to the Hathaway scholarship program; 2 amending award timing for the Hathaway scholarship program; amending eligibility requirements as specified; eliminates 3 4 satisfactory academic progress requirements; eliminates continuous enrollment requirements; eliminates 5 minimum 6 credit hour requirements; amending the calculation of 7 scholarship amounts; deleting obsolete language; making 8 conforming amendments; specifying applicability; repealing provisions; and providing for an effective date. 9 10
