1	WYOMING CLOUD SEEDING MORATORIUM AND BASELINE ACT

3	35-11-2201. Short title.
4	
5	This act is known and may be cited as the "Wyoming Cloud
6	Seeding Moratorium and Baseline Act."
7	
8	35-11-2202. Legislative findings.
9	
10	(a) The legislature finds and declares that:
11	
12	(i) Cloud seeding has been conducted in Wyoming
13	for decades with the stated purpose of increasing
14	precipitation and snowpack;
15	
16	(ii) Scientific studies of cloud seeding show,
17	at best, mixed results. Some studies indicate small
18	increases in localized precipitation, while others show
19	little to no measurable benefit;
20	
21	(iii) Evidence suggests that cloud seeding may
22	redistribute precipitation rather than increase total
23	regional water supply;

2	(iv) Wyoming's water is a crucial public
3	resource, vital to agriculture, municipalities, tribal
4	nations and downstream states under interstate compacts;
5	
6	(v) Without baseline measurements of unseeded
7	years where cloud seeding operations did not occur in
8	Wyoming, Wyoming cannot accurately determine whether cloud
9	seeding programs provide measurable net benefits.

9	35-11-2205. Unauthorized cloud seeding prohibited.
10	
11	(a) Any person conducting cloud seeding or weather
12	modification without authorization during the moratorium
13	period required by W.S. 35-11-2203 commits a misdemeanor
14	punishable by a fine of not more than fifty thousand
15	dollars (\$50,000.00) per occurrence.
16	
17	(b) Each day of unauthorized activity prohibited
18	under this chapter constitutes a separate criminal offense.
19	
20	Section 2. W.S. $9-1-907$ by creating a new subsection
21	(e), 9-1-908 and 9-1-909 are amended to read:

23	9-1-907. Weather modification; permit required;
24	issuance; duration; fee; report of activities; penalties
25	for noncompliance.

1 (e) In accordance with W.S. 35-11-2203(a), no permit 2 shall be issued under this section until on or after 3 October 1, 2036. 4 5 9-1-908. Weather modification; authority to receive and expend funds; purposes. 6 7 8 Subject to the requirements of W.S. 35-11-2201 through 35-11-2205, the state engineer is authorized to receive in the 9 10 name of the state any funds offered or available from any 11 source, and to expend such funds for the expenses of 12 administering this act and for the encouragement of experimentation in weather modification by the University 13 of Wyoming or any other appropriate state or public agency, 14 either by direct grant, by contract or other cooperative 15 16 means. 17 9-1-909. Weather modification; state not liable for 18 19 activities of private persons or groups. 20 21 Subject to the requirements of W.S. 35-11-2201 through 35-11-2205, nothing in W.S. 9-1-905 through 9-1-909 shall be 22 23 construed to impose or accept any liability or

1 responsibility on the part of the state, the board, or any

2 state officials or employees, for any weather modification

3 activities of any private person or group, nor to affect in

4 any way any contractual, tortious, or other legal rights,

5 duties or liabilities between any private persons or

6 groups.
