Industrial siting-wildlife mitigation.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to industrial development and siting; requiring the payment of wildlife mitigation impact costs 2 3 for industrial siting projects as specified; amending the agencies from which the industrial siting division must 4 obtain information and expertise for industrial siting 5 providing definitions; making 6 projects; 7 amendments; specifying applicability; requiring rulemaking; and providing for effective dates. 8 9
- 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 **Section 1**. W.S. 35-12-120 is created to read:

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1	35-12-120. Industrial facilities; wildlife mitigation
2	and impact payments.
3	
4	(a) As used in this section, "eligible entity" means
5	the Wyoming game and fish commission and the Wyoming
6	wildlife and natural resource trust account board.
7	
8	(b) Upon receiving a request for information and
9	recommendations from the division under W.S. 35-12-110(b)
10	for the siting of a proposed industrial facility, each
11	eligible entity may apply to the council for a wildlife
12	impact payment from the permit applicant, in accordance
13	with all of the following:
14	
15	(i) The eligible entity seeking a wildlife
16	impact payment shall complete and submit an application in
17	a form and manner determined by the council and in
18	accordance with this section;
19	
20	(ii) The eligible entity shall provide the
21	following information on its application:

1	(A) The specific impacts on wildlife as a
2	result of the proposed facility, and evidence supporting
3	those impacts;
4	
5	(B) Efforts that the applicant of the
6	proposed industrial facility can take to mitigate or
7	otherwise reduce the impacts on wildlife as a result of the
8	proposed facility;
9	
10	(C) The mitigated and unmitigated impacts
11	that the proposed facility will have on wildlife;
12	
13	(D) The estimated dollar amount of the
14	unmitigated impacts on wildlife;
15	
16	(E) Any other information required by rule
17	of the council.
18	
19	(iii) Before submitting an application under
20	this subsection, the eligible entity may negotiate with the
21	applicant of the proposed industrial facility to determine
22	and agree upon the amount of the wildlife impact payment to
23	be made to the eligible entity. Upon entering an agreement

- 1 under this paragraph, the eligible entity shall submit a
- 2 written report to the council describing the agreement with
- 3 the applicant and the amount of the wildlife impact payment
- 4 that the applicant will make to the eligible entity.

- 6 (c) Wildlife impact payments made and required under
- 7 this section shall be:

- 9 (i) Made by the applicant in accordance with the
- 10 council's order for the wildlife impact payment included
- 11 within the order issued under W.S. 35-12-113(a);

- 13 (ii) Expended by the eligible entity on
- 14 mitigating the identified unmitigated impacts on wildlife
- 15 as a result of constructing the industrial facility.

16

- 17 (d) In awarding or approving a wildlife impact
- 18 payment under this section, the council shall, in the order
- 19 or decision approving a permit, include the terms specified
- 20 in this section and any other conditions or requirements
- 21 for the wildlife impact payment that the council deems
- 22 necessary.

1 (e) The applicant shall make all wildlife impact
2 payments as required in the council's decision or order.

- 4 (f) Each eligible entity receiving a wildlife impact
- 5 payment under this section shall keep records of all
- 6 wildlife impact payments received and all expenditures made
- 7 with funds received from the wildlife impact payments. Each
- 8 eligible entity shall, upon request, provide to the
- 9 council, the director or the administrator any or all
- 10 records kept by the eligible entity under this subsection.

- 12 (q) Wildlife impact payments made under this section
- 13 shall be separate from any impact assistance payment made
- 14 under W.S. 39-15-111(c) and (d) and 39-16-111(d) and (e).

6 the industrial siting council.

11	35-11-109. Powers and duties of director.

13	(a) In addition to any other powers and duties
14	imposed by law, the director of the department shall:
