1 AN ACT relating to elections; requiring independent 2 candidates to swear that they are unaffiliated or not registered with a major or minor political party; revising 3 4 signatures required for the number of independent 5 candidates to appear on the general election ballot; revising the deadline to file a petition as an independent 6 7 candidate; and providing for an effective date.

Independent partisan candidates; form. 3 4 (a) Independent candidates for partisan public 5 offices may be nominated by filing a signed petition in substantially the following form: 6 7 8 PETITION FOR NOMINATION 9 I,, swear or affirm that I was born on, 10(year), that I have been a resident of the State of 11 12 Wyoming since, and that I am a registered voter of 13 Election District No., in Precinct No., County of, residing at, (if for the office of state senator 14 or representative, commissioner or other district office) 15 16 in Senate (House) (Commissioner or other) District, 17 State of Wyoming, (if for the office of governor), that I 18 am an unaffiliated voter or am otherwise not registered in 19 a major or minor political party and that I resided at the 20 physical residential addresses listed below during the past 21 five (5) years, and having obtained the number of 22 signatures required by law for nomination by petition, I hereby request that my name be printed on the official

L4	(b) For a countywide partisan office, a petition
L5	shall be signed by registered electors, resident in the
L6	county and eligible to vote for the petitioner, numbering
L7	not less than two percent (2%) three percent (3%) of the
L8	total number of votes cast for representative in congress

Petitions filed with An independent candidate for partisan 14 15 public office shall give notice of the candidate's intention to be nominated by petition to the secretary of 16 17 state and with to the county clerk shall be filed not less than seventy (70) eighty-one (81) days before a the date of 18 19 the primary election in the applicable general election 20 year. The candidate shall have not more than fourteen (14) additional days after giving notice of the candidate's 21 intention to be nominated by petition to file the petition 22 with the secretary of state and with the county clerk. 23

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2026.
