for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public records; revising time periods for acknowledgement of public records requests and release 2 of public records; providing for an extension of time to 3 release public records; authorizing the ombudsman to refer 4 5 a matter to the attorney general or district attorney; 6 specifying fees for public records; increasing a penalty; 7 authorizing attorney fees; and providing for an effective 8 date.

2	Any person who knowingly or intentionally violates the
3	provisions of this act is liable for a penalty not to
4	exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) two thousand
5	dollars (\$2,000.00). The penalty may be recovered in a
6	civil action and damages may be assessed by the court. $\underline{\text{The}}$
7	court may award the prevailing applicant reasonable
8	attorney fees.
