2 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, no 3 revenue collected from a tax imposed under this title shall 4 be expended to lobby or finance any lobbying. The state of 5 Wyoming and any agency, instrumentality or political subdivision thereof receiving or distributing revenue 6 collected from a tax imposed under this title shall only 7 lobby or finance lobbying using accounts that are separate 8 and independent from any account that receives revenues 9 10 collected from a tax imposed under this title.

(b) As used in this section, "lobby" or "lobbying"

means to attempt to influence legislation or to campaign to

support or oppose a candidate for office, an initiative or

referendum or a ballot proposition. "Lobby" or "lobbying"

does not include:
