3 (i) "Candy" means a preparation of sugar, honey

4 or other natural or artificial sweeteners in combination

5 with chocolate, fruit, nuts or other ingredients or

6 flavorings in the form of bars, drops or pieces. "Candy"

7 shall not include any preparation requiring refrigeration;

9 (ii) "Soft drink" means a nonalcoholic beverage

10 that contains natural or artificial sweeteners. "Soft

11 drink" shall not include a beverage that contains milk,

12 milk products, soy, rice or similar milk substitutes, a

13 beverage that is greater than fifty percent (50%) vegetable

14 or fruit juice by volume or a beverage that is exclusively
