14	WHEREAS, in Wyoming, approximately forty-six percent (46%) of
15	the surface land area is owned by the federal government; and

- 2 WHEREAS, under the federal Mineral Leasing Act, fifty percent
- 3 (50%) of all money received from sales, bonuses, royalties
- 4 and rentals from federal mineral leasing is distributed to
- 5 the states where the lands or deposits are located, excluding
- 6 Alaska; and

7

- 8 WHEREAS, under the federal Mineral Leasing Act, Alaska
- 9 receives ninety percent (90%) of all money received from
- 10 sales, bonuses, royalties and rentals from federal mineral
- 11 leasing; and

12

- 13 WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2024, Wyoming received five hundred
- 14 ninety million nine hundred twenty thousand nine hundred
- 15 seventy-one dollars (\$590,920,971.00) in federal mineral
- 16 royalties; and

- 18 WHEREAS, Congress enacted into law the One Big Beautiful Bill
- 19 Act on July 4, 2025; and

20

- 21 WHEREAS, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act reduces the federal
- 22 mineral royalty rate for oil and gas leasing on federal lands

1 from sixteen and sixty-seven hundredths percent (16.67%) to

2 twelve and one-half percent (12.5%); and

3

4 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rate on

5 oil and gas leasing on federal lands is estimated to reduce

6 Wyoming's state share of federal mineral royalties by

7 approximately six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000.00) in

8 fiscal year 2026, increasing annually to approximately four

9 million dollars (\$4,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2030; and

10

11 WHEREAS, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act reduces the federal

12 mineral royalty rate for coal leasing on federal lands from

13 twelve and one-half percent (12.5) to seven percent (7%); and

14

15 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rate on

16 coal leasing on federal lands is estimated to reduce Wyoming's

17 state share of federal mineral royalties by approximately

18 fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000.00) annually until 2034;

19 and

20

21 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rates

22 will reduce the revenues available for Wyoming's roads,

23 bridges and highways, kindergarten through grade twelve (12)

- 1 education, higher education, capital construction, emergency
- 2 responders and general operations of government; and

3

- 4 WHEREAS, transportation, education and emergency response
- 5 resources are vital to Wyoming and its citizens.

- 7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE
- 8 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

- 10 Section 1. That the Wyoming Legislature requests that
- 11 Congress introduce and enact legislation that will increase
- 12 the state of Wyoming's share of federal mineral royalties
- 13 from fifty percent (50%) to XX percent (XX%).

- 15 **Section 2.** That the Secretary of State of Wyoming
- 16 transmit copies of this resolution to the President of the
- 17 United States, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker
- 18 of the House of Representatives of the United States Congress
- 19 and to the Wyoming Congressional Delegation.
