8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10	Section 1. W.S. 36-1-601 is created to read:

13	FOREST HEALTH GRANT PROGRAM

2 36-1-601. Forest health grant program; duties of

3 state forester; account created; attorney general approval.

5 (a) There is created the forest health grant program.

6 The grant program shall be administered by the state

7 forester, who shall establish the application process and

8 any other requirements of the grant program not otherwise

9 provided by this section.

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11 (b) Grants under the forest health grant program 12 shall pay for not more than seventy-five percent (75%) of 13 the cost of an eligible forest health project as specified in this subsection. Any other source of funds, cash or 14 15 in-kind contributions may be used as matching funds to 16 cover the remainder of a project's costs and the state 17 forester may require that matching funds be obligated to pay for a portion of any project. Forest health projects 18 19 eligible for grant funding under this section shall be 20 conducted on state, local government or private land, shall 21 be necessary in the public interest and shall be designed

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to accomplish one (1) or more of the following:

1	(i) Enhancement of water yield or quality;
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3	(ii) Reduction of the risk of catastrophic
4	wildfire damage;
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6	(iii) Increased production of forest products;
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8	(iv) Improvement of habitat conditions for
9	wildlife and livestock;
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11	(v) Any other project that is beneficial to
12	forest health, that is substantially beneficial to the
13	interest of the state and that has a public purpose as
14	determined by the state forester.
15	
16	(c) No forest health grant shall be made under this
17	section without the written opinion of the attorney general
18	certifying the legality of the grant and all documents
19	connected with the grant and project.
20	
21	(d) There is created the forest health grant program
22	account. The account shall consist of those funds
23	designated to the account by law. Funds in the account

1 shall be used for grants authorized to be made under this

2 section. Any person may also grant, give, transfer, bequest

3 or donate funds to the account. Funds in the account shall

4 be invested as provided by law. Any funds remaining in the

5 account at the end of any fiscal year shall not lapse or

6 revert as provided by W.S. 9-4-207 but shall remain in the

7 account and be used to implement the purposes of this

8 section. Accrued interest and other earnings on unexpended

9 funds within the forest health grant program account shall

10 be credited to the account.

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12 (e) The state forester shall annually report to the

13 joint agriculture, state and public lands and water

14 resources interim committee not later than September 1 on

15 all grants awarded under this section including the amounts

16 of the grants and the projects the grants were authorized

17 to fund.

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19 (f) No forest health grants under this section shall

20 be approved after July 1, 2030 and any unobligated funds

21 remaining in the forest health grant program account on

22 July 1, 2030 shall:

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1 (i) If the source of the funds was not state funds, be returned, without interest or other earnings, to 2 3 the person that granted, gave, transferred, bequeathed or 4 donated the funds pursuant to subsection (d) of this section. If there are multiple sources of funds that are 5 6 not state funds, the funds may be provided on a pro rata basis using the amount of funds available in the account 7 8 and the amount of funds transferred to the account from 9 each source; or 10 11 (ii) If the source of the funds were state 12 funds, revert to the general fund or other state fund from 13 which the funds were initially appropriated. 14 15 Section 2. There is appropriated three million 16 dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the general fund to the forest 17 health grant program account for purposes of implementing this act and making grants authorized by this act. This 18 19 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 20 other purpose without further legislative authorization. 21 Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, 22 this appropriation shall remain in effect and not lapse or

revert at the end of any fiscal period except upon further

1 legislative action. It is the intent of the legislature

that additional funding for this purpose be included in the 2

3 state forester's next standard budget request submitted

4 under W.S. 9-2-1013.

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Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2026. 6
