# Memorandum

**SUBJECT** Interim Priority #1 Wyoming Business Council – Countywide Consensus Funding

This memorandum provides background information on countywide consensus funding, a component of interim topic priority #1. Specifically, this memorandum provides a history of countywide consensus funding and an explanation of the most recently distributed appropriation under the formula and proposed formula during the 2026 Budget Session. This memorandum concludes with a summary of other local government programs for comparative purposes. This memorandum relates to a subdivision of the Joint Appropriation Committee's (JAC) 2026 interim topic priority #1:

The Committee will also assess the benefits, distribution methods, and long-term funding sources for a countywide consensus funding program to assist communities with predictable capital planning resources. The intended outcome is to develop a cohesive statewide strategy of economic development and community infrastructure to support development with draft legislation for the 2027 General Session.

## I. HISTORY OF COUNTYWIDE CONSENSUS FUNDING

The Legislature adopted the first countywide consensus funding block grant in the 2007 General Session in the amount of \$18,665,500. The Legislature adopted similar appropriations over the next four biennium as summarized in Table 1. The Legislature has not appropriated funds for such purposes since the 2014 Budget Session.

**Note:** <sup>^</sup>In 2008, the Legislature also appropriated \$33.4 million from the local government capital construction account (S4), typically appropriated to support the mineral royalty grant (MRG) program, for unfunded or partially

funded large capital construction projects approved and supported by the appropriations in 2008 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 48, Sections 328 and 329. The traditional MRG program was not funded in 2008.

Table 2 illustrates the pertinent inputs of the distribution model for each appropriation. Initially, the Legislature established the distribution of funds to reflect 35 percent shared equally among all 23 counties and 65 percent distributed based on each county's share of statewide population (per capita distribution). In the last three biennia of the countywide consensus appropriations, the Legislature removed the equal distribution component among counties in favor of a 20 percent distribution based upon the inverse per capita assessed valuation and directed 80 percent of the appropriation based on each county's share of statewide population. In all instances, the per capita distribution provided the foundation for distributing a majority of countywide consensus funding among the 23 counties. While the equal distribution methodology provided a minimum amount for all counties, the shift to the inverse per capita assessed valuation methodology directs additional revenue for counties with lower (or no) mineral production and lower industrial, commercial, residential, agricultural and other property valuations.

In all instances, the Legislature specified that countywide consensus appropriations could only be used for capital projects, including capital projects constructed by special districts. To be eligible for the state-distributed grants, each board of county commissioners and the governing bodies of the cities and towns within each county that comprised at least 70 percent of the incorporated population must certify to the State Loan and Investment Board that they have reached agreement on the projects for which the funds would be expended. This concept provides the origins of the "consensus" portion of the "countywide consensus funding" nomenclature. The Legislature also provided that the funds would not revert.

## **II. COUNTYWIDE CONSENSUS FUNDING VARIABLES: 2014, AS ADOPTED, AND 2026, AS PROPOSED**

The last legislative appropriation providing funding for the countywide consensus program occurred in 2014 for the 2015-2016 biennium in the amount of \$70 million in aggregate. Per the legislative appropriation language, the funds were to be distributed 80 percent based upon population of each county

relative to the total state population and 20 percent based upon the inverse per capita assessed valuation. Attachment A provides for the distribution of the \$70 million, by county.

In the 2026 Budget Session, the House of Representatives adopted an amendment to the 2026 Budget Bill that would have distributed any prior appropriations reverted from the Business Ready Community (BRC) program to a countywide consensus funding distribution.<sup>1</sup> At the time, the estimated amount of the reversion was \$54.9 million, although there were projects in various stages of the approval process. While the House of Representatives adopted an amendment that would have appropriated funds for a countywide consensus program in 2026 House Bill 0001, the Joint Conference Committee deleted the amendment.<sup>2</sup> A similar amendment was proposed in the Senate to 2026 House Bill 0107 and ruled out of order.<sup>3</sup> While both of the 2026 amendments would have distributed 80 percent of the distribution by population and 20 percent by inverse per capita assessed valuation, they also had notable differences to the most recent countywide consensus appropriation in 2014:

- Applied a three-year rolling average to the estimated population of each county rather than resort to the most recent decennial census;
- Required the board of county commissions and the governing bodies of at least 50 percent of incorporated municipalities within the county to come to consensus as opposed to governing bodies representing at least 70 percent of the incorporated population;
- Explicitly expanded the permissible use beyond strict capital construction to major maintenance and repair of existing public facilities and infrastructure; and
- Included a two year reversion requirement for unexpended, unencumbered funds.

The estimated distribution, including the calculation methodology, by county, of the unsuccessful 2026 House Bill 0001 amendment can be found in Attachment B.

If the Legislature desires to resurrect a countywide consensus funding program, the following reflect key public policy decision points:

- Under what formula or distribution methodology should appropriated funds be distributed?
- For what purposes may the appropriations be expended?
- What amount should be appropriated?
- Should the appropriation be tied to a specific revenue source and codified or be subject to annual or biennial appropriation by the Legislature?
- What level of consensus within counties should be required in order to receive the distributed grants?

### **III. RELATED LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUNDING PROGRAMS**

The countywide consensus funding approach is unique in its purposes and distribution methodology. There are, however, multiple other state-supported appropriations that directly support counties, cities, towns and special districts. Table 3 summarizes those state programs.

The Office of State Lands and Investments staff prepared a summary of the approved grants, by county, from the last biennium for which the Legislature appropriated funds through this mechanism - reflecting the 2015-2016 biennium. (See Attachment C.) While this summary is not a comprehensive list of all approved grants for projects funded through all countywide consensus appropriations due to accounting system limitations, it serves as a strong illustration of the breadth and type of approved projects for each county from the most recent appropriation.
