A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to water development projects; authorizing
2 specified level I and level II studies; providing
3 appropriations; requiring reports; providing for the
4 reversion of unexpended funds; authorizing unobligated
5 funds to be used to complete other designated projects as
6 specified; providing an appropriation for the office of
7 water programs; extending an existing level II study; and
8 providing for an effective date.

10 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

2 **Section 1. LEVEL I RECONNAISSANCE STUDIES - NEW**

3 DEVELOPMENT. The following sums of money are appropriated
4 from water development account I, as created by W.S. 41-2-
5 124(a)(i), to the water development commission to be
6 expended to conduct the following reconnaissance studies as
7 defined in W.S. 41-2-114. Funds appropriated under this
8 section for a particular project that are in excess of the
9 actual amount necessary to complete the study may, subject
10 to the review and recommendation of the select water
11 committee, be expended by the commission to complete the
12 reconnaissance study for any other project listed in this
13 section. Appropriated funds not expended or obligated prior
14 to July 1, 2029 shall revert to water development account
15 I. The commission shall submit a report to the legislature
16 on each of the following studies prior to the 2028
17 legislative session:

20 section. Appropriated funds not expended or obligated prior
21 to July 1, 2029 shall revert to water development account
22 I. The commission shall submit a report to the legislature

 14 that are in excess of the actual amount necessary to

 16 recommendation of the select water committee, be expended
 17 by the commission to complete the feasibility study for any
 18 other project listed in this section. Appropriated funds
 19 not expended or obligated prior to July 1, 2029 shall
 20 revert to water development account II. The commission
 21 shall submit a report to the legislature on each of the
 22 following studies prior to the 2028 legislative session:

7 **Section 5.** There is appropriated one hundred seventy
8 five thousand dollars (\$175,000.00) to the water
9 development commission from water development account I, as
10 created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i), to fund the office of water
11 programs established under W.S. 41-2-125 for the period
12 beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2028. This
13 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any
14 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds
15 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided
16 by law on June 30, 2028.

18 **Section 6.** 2021 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 11,
19 Section 5, as amended by 2023 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter
20 186, Section 7 is amended to read:

22 **Section 5. LEVEL II FEASIBILITY STUDIES -**
23 DAMS AND RESERVOIRS. In the 2015 Omnibus water
24 bill - planning, 2015 Wyoming Session Laws,
25 Chapter 168, Section 5, the following sums of

1 money are appropriated from water development
2 account III, as created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(iii),
3 to the water development commission to be
4 expended to conduct the following feasibility
5 studies as defined in W.S. 41-2-114. A three (3)
6 year time extension is granted for the Shell
7 Valley Storage - Leavitt Reservoir project and
8 appropriated funds for that project not obligated
9 prior to July 1, 2021 shall revert to water
10 development account III. A six (6) year time
11 extension is granted for the Clear Creek Storage
12 project and funds appropriated for the project
13 but not obligated prior to July 1, 2024 shall
14 revert to water development account III. A **seven**
15 **(7)–nine (9)** year time extension is granted for
16 the Nowood River Storage - Alkali Cr. project and
17 funds appropriated for the project but not
18 obligated prior to **July 1, 2025** **July 1, 2027**
19 shall revert to water development account III.
20 The commission shall submit a report to the
21 legislature prior to the 2020 legislative
22 session: on the Shell Valley Storage - Leavitt
23 Reservoir project study; prior to the 2023

1 legislative session on the Clear Creek Storage
2 study; and prior to the ~~2024~~2026 legislative
3 session on the Nowood River Storage - Alkali Cr.
4 study.
