SNOWMOBILE FEES IN OTHER STATES

This fact sheet outlines annual snowmobile registration, permit, and trail pass fees in 15 states including Wyoming. While some states require both registration fees and trail pass fees, most only require either registration fees or trail pass fees. Additionally, some states have registration or permit fees for two- or three-year periods. The fees in the table below correspond to one year of the fee. The states with the highest fees are New Hampshire, New York, and Vermont. The states with the lowest fees are Colorado, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Oregon. Idaho, Montana, New Hampshire, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah¹, Vermont, and Wisconsin require non-residents to pay higher fees than residents for snowmobile registration, permits, and trail passes. Idaho has the highest fees out of Wyoming’s surrounding states.
