CONTRACT FOR SESSION LAW PRINTING SERVICES

- 1. <u>Parties.</u> The parties to this Contract are the Wyoming Legislature acting by and through the Legislative Service Office, 200 W. 24th Street, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82002 (hereinafter referred to as "LSO") and 1Vision, previously doing business as Vision Graphics, 5105 E. 41st Ave, Denver, Colorado, 80216 (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor").
- 2. <u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Contract is to set forth the terms and conditions by which the Contractor shall print, bind, and deliver the Session Laws of Wyoming for the 2022 Budget Session and the 2021 Special Session.
- 3. <u>Term of Contract.</u> This Contract is effective when all the parties have executed it (Effective Date). The term of the Contract is from the Effective Date through April 30, 2023. All services shall be completed during this term.

This Contract may be extended for three (3), consecutive one (1) year periods. Each extension shall be negotiated with the mutual agreement of both parties. Each extension shall include the same terms as this Contract with an escalation of pricing not to exceed five percent (5%) of the price per page, per year, calculated using the price per page under this Contract. There is no right or expectation of extension and any extension will be determined at the discretion of LSO.

4. <u>Payment.</u>

A. LSO agrees to pay the Contractor for the services described in Section 5 below and as contained in State of Wyoming's Invitation for Bid No. 0227-G and Contractor's response thereto, which are attached to and incorporated into this Contract by this reference. Total payment under this Contract shall not exceed twenty-nine thousand three hundred ninety-six dollars and twenty cents (\$29,396.20) for 550 board bound books with four hundred thirty-two pages (432) pages. A price increase or decrease of nine hundred eighty-four dollars (\$984.00) per 16-page sig and six hundred seventy-eight dollars (\$678.00) per 8-page sig shall be used if the 550 board bound books have more or less than 432 pages.

Upon satisfactory performance as determined by LSO, payment shall be made within thirty (30) days after delivery of the bound volumes of the Session Laws of Wyoming, 2022 Budget Session & 2021 Special Session. Contractor shall submit invoices in sufficient detail to ensure that payments may be made in conformance with this Contract.

B. No payment shall be made for work performed before the Effective Date of this Contract. Should the Contractor fail to perform in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract, payment under this Contract may be

withheld until such time as the Contractor performs its duties and responsibilities to the satisfaction of LSO.

- 5. <u>Responsibilities of Contractor.</u> In accordance with the State of Wyoming's Invitation for Bid No. 0227-G and Contractor's response thereto, the Contractor agrees to print, bind, and deliver the Session Laws of Wyoming for the 2022 Budget Session and 2021 Special Session subject to the following:
 - A. Submit sample swatches of text and cover that the Contractor proposes to use for books prior to printing.
 - **B** Provide page proofs to LSO for corrections after LSO provides the Contractor a copy as required under Section 6A of this Contract.
 - C. Package twenty-seven (27) boxes packaged with ten (10) books in each box. The remaining two hundred eighty (280) books shall be shrink wrapped and individually inserted in boxes fit to size ready to be labeled and mailed. Boxes will be marked to indicate the year of the session laws.

6. <u>Responsibilities of LSO.</u> LSO agrees to:

- A. Furnish Contractor with an electronic copy via e-mail of a print-ready Adobe InDesign or Adobe PDF file of the Session Laws of Wyoming for the 2022 Budget Session and 2021 Special Session, including the Table of Contents and Index. A hard copy can also be provided by LSO upon request.
- **B.** Pay the Contractor in accordance with Section 4 above.

7. <u>General Provisions.</u>

- A. Amendments. Any changes, modifications, revisions, or amendments to this Contract which are mutually agreed upon by the parties to this Contract shall be incorporated by written instrument, executed and signed by all parties to this Contract.
- **B.** Applicable Law, Rules of Construction, and Venue. The construction, interpretation, and enforcement of this Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming, without regard to conflicts of law principles. The terms "hereof," "hereunder," "herein," and words of similar import, are intended to refer to this Contract as a whole and not to any particular provision or part. The Courts of the State of Wyoming shall have jurisdiction over this Contract and the parties. The venue shall be the First Judicial District, Laramie County, Wyoming.
- C. Approval by the Governor and the State Treasurer. Pursuant to Article 3, Section 31 of the Wyoming Constitution, this Contract is subject to the approval of the Governor of Wyoming and the Wyoming State Treasurer.

- **D.** Assignment Prohibited and Contract Shall Not be Used as Collateral. Neither party shall assign or otherwise transfer any of the rights or delegate any of the duties set out in this Contract without the prior written consent of the other party. The Contractor shall not use this Contract, or any portion thereof, for collateral for any financial obligation without the prior written permission of LSO.
- E. Compliance with Laws. Contractor shall keep informed of and comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations in the performance of this Contract.
- **F. Confidentiality of Information.** All documents, data compilations, reports, computer programs, photographs, and any other work provided to or produced by Contractor in the performance of this Contract will be kept confidential by Contractor until publicly released by LSO or until written permission is granted by LSO for its release. If and when Contractor receives a request for information subject to this Contract, Contractor shall notify LSO within ten (10) days of such request and not release such information to a third party unless directed to do so by LSO.

Notwithstanding any conflicting provision in this Contract or any attached or incorporated documents, all records and other information pertinent to this Contract are subject to the Wyoming's Public Records Act, Wyo. Stat.§ 16-4-201 et seq. which may include the custodian of such records denying access to records in accordance with Wyo. Stat. § 16-4-203(d).

- **G.** Entirety of Contract. This Contract, consisting of six (6) pages, the State of Wyoming's Invitation for Bid No. 0227-G, and Contractor's response thereto represent the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersede(s) all prior negotiations, representations, and agreements, whether written or oral.
- H. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable for failure to perform under this Contract if such failure to perform arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the nonperforming party. Such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather. This provision will become effective only if the party failing to perform immediately notifies the other party of the extent and nature of the problem, limits delay in performance to that required by the event, and takes all reasonable steps to minimize delays. This provision will not be effective unless the failure to perform is beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the nonperforming party.
- I. Indemnification. The Contractor shall release, indemnify, and hold harmless the State, LSO, and their officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, suits, liabilities, court awards, damages, costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses arising out of Contractor's failure to perform any of Contractor's duties and obligations hereunder or in connection with the negligent performance of Contractor's duties

or obligations, including, but not limited to, any claims, suits, liabilities, court awards, damages, costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses arising out of Contractor's negligence or other tortious conduct.

- J. Independent Contractor. Contractor shall function as an independent contractor for the purposes of this Contract, and shall not be considered an employee of the State of Wyoming or LSO for any purpose. Consistent with the express terms of this Contract, Contractor shall be free from control or direction over the details of the performance of services under this Contract. Contractor shall assume sole responsibility for any debts or liabilities that may be incurred by Contractor in fulfilling the terms of this Contract, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Contract. Nothing in this Contract will be interpreted as authorizing Contractor or its agents and/or employees to act as an agent or representative for or on behalf of the State of Wyoming or LSO, or to incur any obligation of any kind on the behalf of the State of Wyoming or on behalf of LSO. Contractor agrees that no health/hospitalization benefits, workers' compensation and/or similar benefits available to State of Wyoming employees will inure to the benefit of Contractor or Contractor's agents and/or employees as a result of this Contract.
- K. Nondiscrimination. The Contractor shall comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Wyoming Fair Employment Practices Act (Wyo. Stat. §27-9-105, *et seq.*), the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), 42 U.S.C. §12101, *et seq.*, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and/or any properly promulgated rules and regulations thereto and shall not discriminate against any individual on the grounds of age, sex, color, race, religion, national origin, or disability in connection with the performance under this Contract.
- L. Notices. All notices arising out of, or from, the provisions of this Contract shall be in writing and given to the parties at the address provided under this Contract, either by regular mail, e-mail, or delivery in person. Notice provided by e-mail will be delivered as follows:

- M. Notice and Approval of Proposed Sale or Transfer. Contractor shall provide LSO with the earliest possible advance notice of any proposed sale or transfer or any proposed merger or consolidation of the assets of Contractor. Such notice will be provided in accordance with the notices provision of this Contract. If LSO

determines that the proposed merger, consolidation, sale, or transfer of assets is not consistent with the continued satisfactory performance of the Contractor's obligations under this Contract, then LSO may, at its option, terminate or renegotiate this Contract.

- N. Ownership of Documents. LSO is the official custodian and owns all documents, data compilations, reports, computer programs, photographs, data, and other work provided to or produced by the Contractor in the performance of this Contract. Upon termination of services, for any reason, Contractor agrees to return all such original and derivative information and documents to LSO in a useable format. In the case of electronic transmission, such transmission shall be secured. The return of information by any other means shall be by a parcel service that utilizes tracking numbers. Upon LSO's verified receipt of such information, Contractor agrees to physically and electronically destroy any residual LSO-owned data, regardless of format, and any other storage media or areas containing such information. Contractor agrees to provide written notice to LSO confirming the destruction of any such residual LSO-owned data.
- **O. Publicity.** Any publicity given to the projects, programs or services provided herein, including, but not limited to, notices, information, pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices in whatever form, prepared by or for Contractor, will identify LSO as the sponsoring agency and will not be released without prior written approval from LSO.
- **P.** Severability. Should any portion of this Contract be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the Contract will continue in full force and effect, and the parties may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- Q. Sovereign Immunity. Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-104(a), the State of Wyoming and LSO expressly reserve sovereign immunity by entering into this Contract and specifically retain all immunities and defenses available to them as sovereigns. The parties acknowledge that the State of Wyoming has sovereign immunity and only the Wyoming Legislature has the power to waive sovereign immunity. Designations of venue, choice of law, enforcement actions, and similar provisions shall not be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity. The parties agree that any ambiguity in this Contract will not be strictly construed, either against or for either party, except that any ambiguity as to sovereign immunity will be construed in favor of sovereign immunity.
- **R. Taxes.** Contractor shall pay all taxes and other such amounts required by federal, state and local law, including but not limited to federal and social security taxes, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance and sales taxes.
- **S. Termination of Contract.** This Contract may be terminated, without cause, by LSO upon thirty (30) days written notice. This Contract may be terminated by LSO immediately for cause if the Contractor fails to perform in accordance with the terms of this Contract.

- T. Third Party Beneficiary Rights. The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Contract will not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Contract will operate only between the parties to this Contract, and will inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Contract. The provisions of this Contract are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Contract.
- U. Time is of the Essence. Time is of the essence in all provisions of the Contract.
- V. **Titles Not Controlling.** Titles of sections and subsections are for reference only and will not be used to construe the language in this Contract.
- W. Waiver. The waiver of any breach of any term or condition in this Contract will not be deemed a waiver of any prior or subsequent breach. Failure to object to a breach will not constitute a waiver.
- 8. <u>Signatures</u>. The parties to this Contract, either personally or through their duly authorized representatives, have executed this Contract on the dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understood, and agreed to the terms and conditions of this Contract.

- Parties, The Parties to this Amendment Number One ("Amendment One") to the Contract for Session Law Printing Services are the Wyoming Legislature acting by and through the Legislative Service Office, 200 W. 24th Street, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82002 (hereinafter referred to as "LSO") and 1Vision, previously doing business as Vision Graphics, 5105 E. 41st Ave, Denver, Colorado, 80216 (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor").
- 2. <u>Purpose.</u> This Amendment One shall constitute the first amendment to the Contract between the Agency and the Contractor executed on May 24, 2022. The purpose of this Amendment One is to: 1) increase the total Contract dollar amount by six thousand six hundred dollars (\$6,600.00) to thirty-six thousand fifty-one dollars and forty-six cents (\$36,051,46); and 2) require the Contractor to correct the misprinting of the cover and spine of the Session Laws for the 2022 Budget Session and 2021 Special Session.

The Original Contract, effective May 24, 2022, required the Contractor to print, bind, and deliver the Session Laws of Wyoming for the 2022 Budget Session and the 2021 Special Session for a total Contract amount of twenty-nine thousand four hundred fifty-one dollars and forty-six cents (\$29,451.46) for 550 board bound books with four hundred thirty-two pages (432) pages, with an expiration date of April 30, 2023.

- 3. <u>Term of the Amendment.</u> This Amendment One shall commence upon the date the last required signature is affixed hereto and shall remain in full force and effect through April 30, 2023.
- 4. <u>Amended Responsibilities of Contractor</u>. Responsibilities of the Contractor are hereby amended as follows:
 - A. Collect the Session Laws for the 2022 Budget Session and 2021 Special Session previously delivered to the Agency not later than October 14, 2022.
