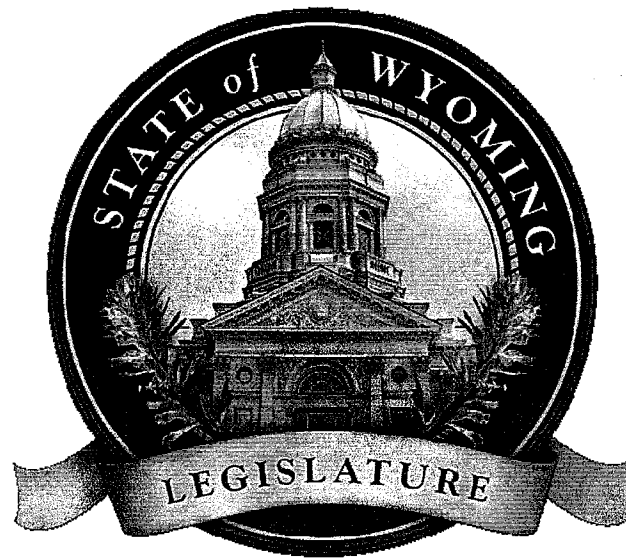

## ANNUAL REPORT

January 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012

### CREATION

The Legislative Service Office was created by an Act of the Forty-First Legislature, Chapter 113, Session Laws of Wyoming 1971. It commenced operations on March 1, 1971. The Office provides research and bill drafting services for legislative standing or interim committees and for individual legislators, including pre-filing and distribution of proposed legislation prior to legislative sessions; revision and recompilation of the laws of Wyoming; preparation of copy and contracting for the printing and publishing of all revisions, compilations, session laws, journals and digests; and accounting for all legislative expenditures, supplies and properties. In addition, members of the office staff prepare administrative rule reviews and reports for the Management Council, conduct program evaluations of executive agencies under the direction of the Management Audit Committee, and conduct fiscal studies and budget analysis for the Joint Appropriations Committee and other legislative committees.

Policies, rules and regulations governing general operations of the Office and its relationship to legislative standing committees and individual legislators are made by a Management Council composed of thirteen legislators – six members from each house and one member elected at large.

The Director is employed by and subject to the direction of the Management Council. The Director with the approval of the Management Council employs LSO employees.

## **MEETING PAYMENTS BY LEGISLATOR INTERIM MEETINGS – 2012**

The following apply to the information contained in this list:

1. This list contains mileage, per diem and salary payments to legislators for participation in official legislative interim work. Official legislative interim work consists of meetings of interim and select committees of the legislature, plus other authorized legislative meetings. Beginning in 2009, legislators are also compensated ½ salary for preparation for each day an interim committee meets. In addition, legislators are compensated ½ salary for travel to and/or from an interim committee meeting. Travel salary is not paid for travel occurring on a day the member receives salary for the committee meeting.
2. Note that the number of meetings attended by a legislator is primarily a function of two factors: the number of committees to which that legislator has been appointed and the number of meetings during an interim that a committee meets. Some legislators are appointed to several committees while some may serve on only one committee. Due to the scope of committee workload during an interim, some committees may meet only for a day or two while others meet several times.
3. The Management Council at the conclusion of each session approves interim committee study topics and budgets for meetings. Committees may not exceed those budgets without Council approval.
4. Salary and per diem payments for interim meetings held in a legislator's hometown or of short duration, e.g. a compressed video meeting, may be at a reduced level in accordance with Management Council policy as reflected in the Travel Regulations Handbook.
5. This list does not contain payments to legislators for salary, per diem and mileage related to general, budget or special sessions of the Legislature. Legislators, who live outside Cheyenne, receive payment for round trip mileage to and from the session plus per diem for travel days to and from the session. All legislators receive salary and per diem for each day from convening to adjournment of each session. Legislators living outside Cheyenne are entitled to be reimbursed for mileage for one trip each week should they travel home.

1. This list contains travel and per diem payments (actual expenses) to legislators for out of state travel on official legislative business. The Legislature participates in several organizations such as the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), The Energy Council, the Council of State Governments (CSG), etc. The presiding officers appoint legislators to committees of these organizations. Any legislator may attend without prior approval of the Speaker and President a maximum of two out of state meetings per year subject to availability of budget. Travel in excess of the two authorized meetings would require Management Council approval.
2. Most out of state travel involves legislators who have been appointed to committees of organizations in which the Legislature participates.
3. The Management Council must approve any out of state travel to a meeting outside the continental United States (lower 48).
4. Legislators receive reimbursement for actual expenses associated with authorized out of state travel, subject to limitations contained in Management Council travel policies. Legislators receive no salary when engaged in authorized out of state travel.

## **CONSTITUENT SERVICE ALLOWANCE REIMBURSEMENT TO LEGISLATORS – 2012**

The following apply to the information contained in this list:

1. W.S. 28-5-106 allows each member of the legislature to receive a constituent service allowance of not to exceed \$750 per calendar quarter. Funds not expended in one quarter may be applied to expenses incurred in another quarter provided total reimbursement for the calendar year does not exceed \$3,000.
2. The purpose of the allowance is to defray expenses incurred by the member in providing services to and on behalf of their constituents.
3. Allowable expenses are defined by Management Council policy and include such items as: reimbursement for in-state travel expenses, postage, and certain communication services.

Exploration and research of the statutes governing construction of facilities on the state fairgrounds to ensure uniform construction. Review of the pesticide licensure in Wyoming, including reciprocity of licensure from other states. Discussion of a commission style Department of Agriculture that would include the functions performed by the Wyoming Livestock Board and the Board of Agriculture. Review of the predator refund statutes to address payment by out-of-state leaseholders. Continue study of possible solutions to damage caused by large game to agriculture producers.

**Priority #: 3** State Lands and Investments, including the State Forestry Division

**Topics:** State funded conservation easements; mitigation of the Bark Beetle; common carrier pipelines.

Review of state funded conservation easements and guiding statutory provisions to explore simplification. Explore options for creation of long term plans to mitigate damage by the Bark Beetle to Wyoming's forests. Review the concerns of landowners and the bonding requirements for pipeline common carriers.

## **JOINT TRANSPORTATION, HIGHWAYS AND MILITARY AFFAIRS INTERIM COMMITTEE**

### **Priority #: 1 Wyoming Department of Transportation Funding**

This topic will include a broad review of the Department of Transportation's current revenue streams and financial structure. The Committee will consider the history and evolution of WyDOT's funding formulas. The Committee will consider highway funding options including tolling, increasing fuel taxes, imposing a ton-mile tax, implementation of an optional \$.01 sales tax and the benefits of modifying WyDOT's overall funding model. This review will be conducted jointly with the Joint Revenue Interim Committee. LSO staff will coordinate all tasks and information between the two committees. **[Study Modified by Management Council]**

### **Priority #: 2 Transportation Issues**

The Committee will consider statutory amendments necessary to comply with changes to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Act. The Committee also will consider whether amendments are necessary to harmonize statutory provisions related to restricted driver's licenses and graduated driver's licenses.

### **Priority #: 3 Military Affairs**

The Committee will consider ways to enhance the Military Department's ability to recruit students into the Wyoming National Guard Youth Challenge Program. The Committee will consider military-related interstate issues, including stream-lined professional licensing for military spouses and recognition of military training in professional licensing. The Committee will review state active duty medical coverage, payment and reimbursement issues. Finally, the Committee will study the status and condition of armories in the Big Horn Basin and consider the potential reorganization of those armories.

### **Priority #: 4 Veterans' Affairs**

The Committee will consider differences in benefits offered to combat and non-combat veterans and consider whether changes need to be made to equalize benefits. The Committee also will consider new legislation which clarifies that VA disability benefits cannot be considered divisible property in divorce proceedings. Finally the Committee will receive updates on the need for skilled nursing care for veterans.

## **JOINT MINERALS, BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE**

Priority #: 1 Joint Subcommittee on Federal Natural Resource Management Issues.

A Joint Subcommittee, consisting of the Co-Chairmen of the Joint Agriculture, State and Public Lands & Water Resources Committee and the Joint Minerals, Business and Economic Development Interim Committee, the Senate Minority Leader and the House of Representatives Minority Floor Leader, or their designees, shall meet as necessary to review existing or proposed federal policies or action which may impact the management, development or use of the state's natural resources. The Joint Subcommittee shall develop and forward to the Governor and the appropriate legislative committees recommended legislative responses to federal policies and actions necessary to protect the interests of the State of Wyoming.

Additional Budget Request: It is anticipated that the Joint Subcommittee will hold four (4) one (1) day meetings and will require an additional \$16,000.00 for salaries, travel, per diem and expenses associated with the Joint Subcommittee meetings.

The authority of the subcommittee shall only be to make recommendations to the appropriate standing committee. The appropriate standing committee may then consider developing legislation. [Added by Management Council]

Priority #: 2 State Energy Issues

The Committee shall take testimony and development legislation concerning issues relating to energy production, transmission, consumption and value added industries in Wyoming. The Committee will consider a state energy policy, advanced conversion technologies, impacts to local communities from mineral and energy development, hybrid energy systems, natural gas as a transportation fuel, pipeline corridors, possible new coal markets, small renewable energy sources and energy efficiency, enhanced oil recovery, trona and related products and other issues facing the Wyoming energy sector.

Priority #: 3 Department of Environmental Quality Amendments, Permitting and Regulations and Solid Waste Subcommittee

The Department of Environmental Quality shall report to the Committee on issues surrounding implementation of general permits, greenhouse gas regulations and other permitting issues. The department shall also report to the Committee on possible amendments to the Innocent Owner statutes.

The Committee chairmen will create a Subcommittee of two (2) representatives and two (2) senators to take testimony and propose legislation to the Committee to amend activities for authorized expenditures from the municipal solid waste landfill account.

Additional Budget Request: It is anticipated that the Subcommittee will hold two (2) one (1) day meetings and will require an additional \$4,500.00 for salaries, travel, per diem and expenses associated with the Subcommittee meetings.

The authority of the subcommittee shall only be to make recommendations to the appropriate standing committee. The appropriate standing committee may then consider developing legislation. [Added by Management Council]

Priority #: 4 University of Wyoming Energy Programs.

The Committee shall take testimony and consider sponsoring legislation concerning duties imposed on the Committee by 2012 House Bill 121 as they relate to development of a renovation and reconstruction plan for the college of engineering and the development of a plan for the use of abandoned mine land funds for the support and enhancement of technologies important to the economy of the Wyoming. The Committee shall also consider program funding for the School of Energy Resources and processes to integrate the University of Wyoming more fully into the state's economy.

Priority #: 5 Reports and Updates

The Committee will receive and consider reports required by law and updates from various agencies, including but not limited to the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission and the Office of State Lands and Investments, Department of Environmental Quality, the School of Energy Resources, Wyoming Business Council, the Division of Banking, the Wyoming Pipeline Authority, the Wyoming Infrastructure Authority, the Energy Producing States Coalition the Joint Subcommittee on Federal Natural Resource Management and the Nuclear Energy Task Force.

## **JOINT LABOR, HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES INTERIM COMMITTEE**

### **Priority #: 1 Medicaid Review**

Medicaid is a primary cost driver in the State's budget. The Committee will monitor and review all aspects of the program, including program growth projections, eligibility and benefit changes if the Affordable Care Act is upheld, cost saving opportunities, waiver program waiting lists and possible innovative waiver programs involving such things as co-pays and medical case management.

### **Priority #: 2 Health insurance exchanges**

The Committee will monitor the Health Insurance Exchange Steering Committee and respond as needed. As part of the study, the Committee will explore the sale of health insurance policies across state lines as part of or independent of a health insurance exchange.

### **Priority #: 3 Response to federal initiatives and agency reports**

The Committee's jurisdiction includes areas that require state response to federal legislative or regulatory initiatives, as well as areas that require state executive branch reports. The Committee will monitor and respond as needed to federal initiatives and state agency reports.

### **Priority #: 4 Public health preventive measures**

Many areas of public health are inter-related. Effective preventive health may reduce costs of private insurance and reduce demand on public health benefit programs. The Committee will study all aspects of public health, to include: statewide immunization program; acquired brain injury prevention/management; supervision of and funding for public health nurses; wellness/prevention in publicly funded health programs, including state employees.

### **Priority #: 5 Involuntary hospitalization**

Review and evaluate possible changes at the Wyoming State Hospital to increase capacity for Title 25 patients. Schizophrenic and geriatric patients require extended hospitalizations, causing increased use of private placements that are costly and burdensome to county governments. The Committee will look at the causes of the bed shortage at WSH and possible solutions, including treatment changes to decrease length of stay and address specialized geriatric psychiatric care needs.
