LEGISLATIVE SERVICE OFFICE ANNUAL REPORT

January 1, 2013 - December 31, 2013

CREATION

The Legislative Service Office was created by an Act of the Forty-First Legislature, Chapter 113, Session Laws of Wyoming 1971. It commenced operations on March 1, 1971. The Office provides research and bill drafting services for legislative standing or interim committees and for individual legislators, including pre-filing and distribution of proposed legislation prior to legislative sessions; revision and recompilation of the laws of Wyoming; preparation of copy and contracting for the printing and publishing of all revisions, compilations, session laws, journals and digests; and accounting for all legislative expenditures, supplies and properties. In addition, members of the office staff prepare administrative rule reviews and reports for the Management Council, conduct program evaluations of executive agencies under the direction of the Management Audit Committee, and conduct fiscal studies and budget analysis for the Joint Appropriations Committee and other legislative committees.

Policies, rules and regulations governing general operations of the Office and its relationship to legislative standing committees and individual legislators are made by a Management Council composed of thirteen legislators – six members from each house and one member elected at large.

The Director is employed by and subject to the direction of the Management Council. The Director with the approval of the Management Council employs LSO employees.

MEETING PAYMENTS BY LEGISLATOR INTERIM MEETINGS – 2013

The following apply to the information contained in this list:

- 1. This list contains mileage, per diem and salary payments to legislators for participation in official legislative interim work. Official legislative interim work consists of meetings of interim and select committees of the legislature, plus other authorized legislative meetings. Beginning in 2009, legislators are also compensated ½ salary for preparation for each day an interim committee meets. In addition, legislators are compensated ½ salary for travel to and/or from an interim committee meeting. Travel salary is not paid for travel occurring on a day the member receives salary for the committee meeting.
- 2. Note that the number of meetings attended by a legislator is primarily a function of two factors: the number of committees to which that legislator has been appointed and the number of meetings during an interim that a committee meets. Some legislators are appointed to several committees while some may serve on only one committee. Due to the scope of committee workload during an interim, some committees may meet only for a day or two while others meet several times.
- 3. The Management Council at the conclusion of each session approves interim committee study topics and budgets for meetings. Committees may not exceed those budgets without Council approval.

Legislators, who live outside Cheyenne, receive payment for round trip mileage to and from the session plus per diem for travel days to and from the session. All legislators receive salary and per diem for each day from convening to adjournment of each session. Legislators living outside Cheyenne are entitled to be reimbursed for mileage for one trip each week should they travel home.

The following apply to the information contained in this list:

- 1. This list contains travel and per diem payments (actual expenses) to legislators for out of state travel on official legislative business. The Legislature participates in several organizations such as the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), The Energy Council, the Council of State Governments (CSG), etc. The presiding officers appoint legislators to committees of these organizations. Any legislator may attend without prior approval a maximum of two out of state meetings per year subject to availability of budget. Travel in excess of the two authorized meetings requires Management Council approval.
- 2. Most out of state travel involves legislators who have been appointed to committees of organizations in which the Legislature participates.
- 3. The Management Council must approve any out of state travel to a meeting outside the continental United Sates (lower 48).
- 4. Legislators receive reimbursement for actual expenses associated with authorized out of state travel, subject to limitations contained in Management Council travel policies. Legislators receive no salary when engaged in authorized out of state travel.

JOINT JUDICIARY INTERIM COMMITTEE

Priority #: 1 Juvenile Justice

The Committee will receive reports and consider areas for possible improvement to the juvenile justice system, including jurisdiction, data collection, procedural improvements and more effective use of state and court resources.

Priority #: 2 Mental Health and Involuntary Commitment

The Committee will examine legal issues and concerns with respect to mental health treatment and facilities and the involuntary civil commitment, specifically procedural process to reduce the costs to the State. [Modified by Management Council]

Priority #: 3 Detention and Sentencing

The Committee will review statutes relating to sentencing and detention, including probation, parole and criminal history records, supervision and apprehension of offenders and post-conviction relief issues.

Priority #: 4 Alternative Sentencing Options

The Committee will study potential programs and options for sentencing aimed at reducing state and community costs and decreasing recidivism, including the treatment and sentencing for drug and alcohol offenses (24/7 Sobriety Program) and home incarceration.

The Committee will consider possible options for uniformity and simplification of statutes imposing criminal penalties, specifically misdemeanors, and will review the elements of certain criminal offenses, specifically aggravated assault and second degree murder.

Priority #: 6 Court Reporters

The Committee will receive reports relating to court reporters and investigate the need for legislation to address issues specific to reporting of court proceedings.

Priority #: 7 Informational Reports

The Committee will receive information regarding various judiciary matters including jury pool selection and game wardens/state park rangers law enforcement duties.

JOINT APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE

Priority #: 1 Funding for landfills & options to modify revenue streams for LUST.

Pursuant to 2013 Budget Bill the committee is to review and act on the November 15, 2013 report and recommendations of the Joint Minerals, Business and Economic Development Interim Committee regarding long-term funding for landfills and options to modify the revenue streams supporting the leaking underground storage tank (LUST) program.

Priority #: 2 Wyoming public employees' retirement, insurance and compensation.

Review of various plans, including but not limited to Fireman A and B, and Highway Patrol and Game Warden plan; consideration of contribution levels in light of assumed investment performance and mortality rates; and consideration of potential to consolidate plans. The Committee will assess opportunities to expand the potential participants in the state's Group Health Insurance Program, e.g., expansion to other employees of political subdivisions. Review long-term market comparisons to state employee compensation.

Priority #: 3 Receive reports and review legislatively designated investment statutes

Review parameters of permissible investments and investment levels of permanent funds, and use of permanent funds as loans to promote economic development. Review shall include long term costs to income and risk analysis of large loans. The Committee is to receive numerous reports and propose legislation on identified issues related to the state budget.

Priority #: 4 Game and Fish and Department of Transportation budget review

Pursuant to 2013 HB 78, the Committee is to conduct a review of Game and Fish Department (report due August 1) and Department of Transportation (report due October 1) budgets. The Committee will develop recommendations for future review and analysis of these budgets by JAC.

Priority #: 5 Review of major funds

The Committee will review major funds, including the Budget Reserve Account, Legislative Stabilization Reserve Account, Permanent Wyoming Mineral Trust Fund, Hathaway Student Scholarship Account, School Foundation Program, School Capital Construction Account, Common School Account, and Permanent Land Fund Holding Account in terms of appropriate levels of spending and savings, permanent versus intermediate savings, and revenue diversification.

The Committee will assess revenues and expenditures of the SFP and SCCA, including funding decisions outside of the school finance model, the regional cost adjustment and pursuant to statute, recommend K-12 external cost adjustment (ECA) level in November 2013. [Study deleted by Management council]

Priority #: 6 5 Miner's Hospital

The Committee will review issues associated with the Miner's Hospital including (i) payor of last resort; (ii) indirect effects on miner's hospital fund from the federal Affordable Care Act; (iii) contracts between service providers and Miner's Hospital board; and (iv) long term sustainability of program with the known revenue available for the program.

Priority #: 7 6 Community college major maintenance

The Committee will review and codify major maintenance space allocations, costs; review opportunites for operations and maintenance funding; and review funding formula associated with community college major maintenance.

Priority #: 8 7 State government leased space

Review state government leased space in Cheyenne and statewide. Develop recommendations on efforts associated with the construction of a state office building in conjunction with Capitol renovation plans.

Priority #: 9 8 Contact state agency directors and institutions.

The Committee will divide into four member subcommittees and review/visit state agency directors, institutions and facilities with potential exception budget requests, budget reductions, or capital construction budget requests.

Priority # 9 Agency Budget Review

The Committee will review proposed 2%, 4% and 6% budget cuts as submitted by the Community College Commission, WICHE, University of Wyoming, and UW-Medical Education, and proposed 2% budget cuts for the Courts. [Study added by Management Council]

Additionally the Committee is requesting that each of the three subcommittees be provided funds mileage and per diem for three days of meetings. , including salary, mileage and per diem. [Modified by Management Council]

The Select Committee on Legislative Facilities is responsible for addressing furnishings, remodeling, and space needs in the legislative areas of the Capitol building, including oversight of facilities projects specifically approved and funded during the session.

Priority #: 2 Capitol Renovation Planning

The Select Committee will serve as the clearinghouse to develop consensus in the legislative branch regarding the Legislature's vision for Capitol renovation and will provide recommendations to Council for consideration by the Task Force on Capitol Rehabilitation and Restoration.

The Select Committee typically schedules two or three 1-day meetings during the year.

SELECT COMMITTEE ON TRIBAL RELATIONS

Priority #: 1 Priority #: 1 General Responsibilities

Created by the Management Council, the Select Committee on Tribal Relations works with the Eastern Shoshone Indian Tribe, the Northern Arapaho Indian Tribe and various state agencies to address services and needs on the Wind River Indian Reservation. The Committee addresses health and safety, water (including potable water to homes), education, transportation, gaming, communications, minerals, revenue, economic development and other issues that are a concern to the citizens on and near the Reservation.

Priority #: 2 Youth and Juvenile Education and Services

The Committee will review issues relating to education and youth on the Reservation, including academic achievement and graduation rates. The Committee proposes to meet jointly with the Joint Education Interim Committee to explore mechanisms to increase academic success of youth on the Reservation. The Committee will also receive updates and consider juvenile justice and detention issues.

Priority #: 3 Healthcare

The Committee will receive information on the effects of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and will consider healthcare issues affecting the Reservation community, including issues relating to mental health, substance abuse and suicide.

Priority #: 4 Water and Land Use

The Committee will receive information on water and land use on the Reservation, including updates on the Wind River Irrigation Project, water development and storage, energy production and concerns regarding land ownership.

Priority #: 5 Infrastructure

The Committee will hear reports on public service infrastructure and utility corridors, including updates on broadband expansion, natural gas facilities, solid waste management and infrastructure necessary for housing development.

Priority #: 6 Reports

The Committee will receive updates on other important issues affecting the Reservation community, including updates on the Law and Order Commission and eagle feathers.

Priority #: 7 Tentative Meeting Schedule

The Committee anticipates having two meetings. The Committee plans to meet in May and early November. The Committee will coordinate its May meeting to allow a joint meeting with the Joint Education Interim Committee to consider academic achievement.

The primary responsibility of the Select Committee is to provide oversight of the Legislature's computer, audio/video and Web site development by the LSO information technology staff. The Committee will review and update the Legislature's current information strategy to continue to guide technology development for the legislative branch.

Priority #: 2 General Responsibilities Relating to Legislative Process

The primary responsibility of the Select Committee is to review and recommend rule and process changes and other innovations to enhance the efficient, open and transparent operations of the Legislature.

Priority #: 3 General Responsibilities Relating to Public Information & Public Outreach

As previously assigned by Management Council, the Select Committee on Legislative Technology and Process will oversee legislative public outreach initiatives and efforts to improve the information available to the public about legislative activities.

Priority #: 4 Monitoring of SharePoint Implementation

The Select Committee will provide oversight of the conversion of the Legislature's existing technology systems to the new SharePoint platform. The first priority will be to replace the bill drafting, tracking and processing systems (which will be referred to as the Legislative Management System or LMS) during this interim and the Committee will also begin planning how to deploy SharePoint for legislative and public information needs in the future. The Committee will evaluate the need for policy changes based on the ways in which technology can be better deployed to improve legislative operations.

Priority #: 5 Session-Specific Technology, Process and Public Information Issues

The Select Committee will review the following session-related activities: joint conference committee notification process; amendment distribution process and evaluation of standardization between House and Senate; and electronic voting and recorded vote procedures.
