SUBJECT: Hathaway Scholarship Program Annual Reporting

In administering the Hathaway Scholarship, W.S. 21-16-1308(c) requires the Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) to “establish annual reporting procedures for purposes of policy analysis and program evaluation and providing accurate data to the legislature and governor relative to the program’s impact on the state and on students.” As such, the WDE annually provides a statistical series of reports on the Hathaway Scholarship Program. The series of statistical reports, included as Appendix A, include links to the following data:

2022 Hathaway Scholarship Program Highlights

Notable Information:

- [Total Market Value](#) as of September 30, 2022 --- \$643.9 million.
- [Total Investment Earnings](#) FY21 --- \$31.9 million.
 - The Scholarship Corpus paid \$16.13 million to students during the 2021-22 school year.
- In the school year 2021-22, 73 more students initiated the scholarship compared to the prior year.
